


## A majority of Mississippians oppose the Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. JWHO to overturn Roe v. Wade.

**Only 18% of Mississippians** think abortion should be illegal in all cases. **81% of Mississippians** think abortion should be legal in some form—and **32%** think abortion should be legal in all cases.

The majority of Mississippians believe women should have the choice to have an abortion up to 16 weeks into pregnancy.

**84% of Mississippians** believe individuals have the general right to privacy in making decisions related to their bodies.\*



Contraception

71% of Mississippians do not view emergency contraception such as IUDs and Plan B as methods of abortion.

## Criminalization

83% of Mississippians oppose criminal prosecutions or investigations of women for possibly having an abortion.

**79% of Mississippians** oppose Phillip Gunn's proposal that would allow the state to collect medical records of anyone suspected of having an abortion.

- **86% of Mississippians** oppose legislation allowing state officials to monitor internet history to learn if they have visited an online pharmacy to order abortion pills.
- **54% of Mississippians** oppose Personhood laws that define a fertilized egg as a person.
- **46% of Mississippians** support allowing doctors to prescribe the abortion pill through telehealth services.

## Legislative Agenda

The vast majority of Mississippians believe the Legislature is failing to invest in the well-being of women and children.



**76%** support extending Mississippi's postpartum Medicaid coverage from 60 days to 12 months.

**76%** support expanding Medicaid to provide health insurance to low-income Mississippians.
